



FY 2019 UPDATE

BY THE NUMBERS

- 75 Homes built, 91 families served
- Our annual title has built 95 homes around the world
- 230 volunteers contributed 6,975 hours helping with construction, ReStore, and office tasks
- 532 individuals, businesses, and organizations contributed \$437,073 in funds, goods, and services
- Profits from ReStore operations ensure that 100% of donor contributions are used to build Habitat homes
- Another benefit of ReStore is that we keep useable building materials out of the landfill. For every \$1.00 in ReStore sales 1.3 pounds of materials have been kept out of the landfill
- Over \$325,000 saved by Habitat homeowners through BVHfH interest-free mortgage loans has been invested in businesses, services, and savings in our community

- For the 7th year, long-time supporter Cathedral of the Rockies purchased the materials and framed a house for Boise Valley Habitat for Humanity. The 2019 home is located at Tradewinds subdivision in Meridian

THE HABITAT FOR HUMANITY STORY

Habitat for Humanity International was founded in 1976 in Americus, Georgia when Millard and Linda Fuller decided to do something to give their lives more meaning. The idea that became Habitat grew from their work at a community co-op farm where they developed the concept of *Partnership Housing* as a way to address the poverty they saw around them.

Habitat now works in over 1,400 communities in all 50 states and in approximately 70 countries worldwide. It has helped more than **13 million** people achieve stability and independence through safe, decent and affordable shelter.

TRADEWINDS HOMES

This year we completed our fourth and final home in the new Tradewinds development in Meridian. These homes will help address the critical need for affordable housing throughout Ada County. These single-family homes in offer four Low to Very Low Income families the opportunity to own their own homes in close proximity to schools, churches, the new South Meridian YMCA, a new city park, and a myriad of new businesses and retail establishments in various stages of construction. Like all Habitat for Humanity families, these new homeowners will begin building equity for their future through homeownership.
